# **CHÂTEAU OF LA BUSSIERE**

To the east of Orléans, this private château is known as "the fisherman's château" and belongs to the Bommelaer family. Walk in the gardens, escape game, garden game, painting and other activities are proposed. *Open from April to October and over Christmas* **www.chateau-de-la-bussiere.fr/uk** 

#### **CHÂTEAU OF MAINTENON**

Louis XIV gave the château of Maintenon to his secret wife, Madame de Maintenon. It is known for its garden from Le Nôtre. Thematics visits for group are proposed such as : "Lady's château" ; "Everyone to the Garden" and "A Tailor-made château".

## CHÂTEAU OF MEUNG-SUR-LOIRE

Known as the château with two faces", there are 20 rooms, beautifully fur nished. Moreover, visitor will discover underground passages! VIP visits are possible : the Enlightments' tour (**NEW**), The oeno-historical tour and the seigniorial Tour. Open April to November and Christmas.

# **CHÂTEAU OF TALCY**

Although built at the same time of the great castles in the Loire valley, Talcy remains untouched by the popular Italian style and its love of decoration. The château has retained the interior with the unique furniture of the 18th century. It's a hidden treasure.

## **CHÂTEAU OF CHAMPCHEVRIER**

Champchevrier is a private château which is still occupied by its owners, since 1728. Discover the château's renaissance architecture, moats which are still filled with water, secret rooms and the French tradition of hunting with hounds. They are offering a theatrical candlelight tour.

Activities : lunch or diner in the chateau , wine tasting, guided visit.

# CHÂTEAU OF BOUGES

Nestled in the heart of an 80-hectare park, this château is a replica of the Petit Trianon in Versailles, complete with French gardens, an English park, a pond and flower gardens. The château's stables are a must-see for any visitor! *Open from March to November* **www.chateau-bouges.fr/en** 

#### LA FERTE SAINT-AUBIN

Built at the end of the 16th century, La Ferté Saint-Aubin Castle is classified as a Historical Monument. Surrounded by moats, the building has an elegant French garden from the first half of the 17th century. Activities : Cooking show and tasting of biscuit inside the kitchen of the château, private visit, treasure hunt. Free access to the stable and the parc. Open all days during summer. All year during holidays and weekend in May and June. www.chateau-ferte.com/fr/







On 30th November 2000, the Loire Valley was named a UNESCO World Heritage Site thanks to its incredible cultural landscapes. The area covers 280km, from Sully-sur-Loire (east Loire Valley) to Chalonnes-sur-Loire (west Loire Valley).
