Gardens classified as birds refuge (LPO) in Amboise

The gardens of the Royal Château of Amboise are home to 82 species of birds. 22 nesting boxes have been installed in the gardens to protect these species. Guided tours in the gardens are also offered to retrace the history of these gardens and discuss maintenance practices.
